On our return from half term, I would like to focus on the situation around COVID-19. As you will be aware, (at the time of writing) the Academy has had 7 confirmed positive cases. Although this remains low, we expect that we will have to continue to deal with cases as are schools around the country.

We know also, that there have been cases in the community and there is understandable anxiety. The same anxieties exist for staff and we are trying to hold a balance between ensuring maximum safety and providing continued No-Limits education. It is a difficult situation for us all.

For clarity, we fully track all cases including those related cases reported to us by parents/carers. This helps us monitor and look at the big picture. When we have a reported case, or a pattern of cases, we take advice immediately from the DfE and the Local Public Health team. We then are advised on a course of action. This week, this meant that we are providing a number of Year 7 students education from home.

We are restricted in the amount of information we can give out due to GDPR regulations. However, rest assured that we are always working with professionals to take the best "safety first" action available and we will communicate with you if there is any need for us to take action.

During this time, working together is the key. You can help us by communicating any need to self-isolate, related positive results e.g. brothers or sisters. It is also vital that if your child is ill, that they are kept off school and attendance are contacted.

It is tough at the moment but working together we will maintain safety and continue to provide No-Limits education.

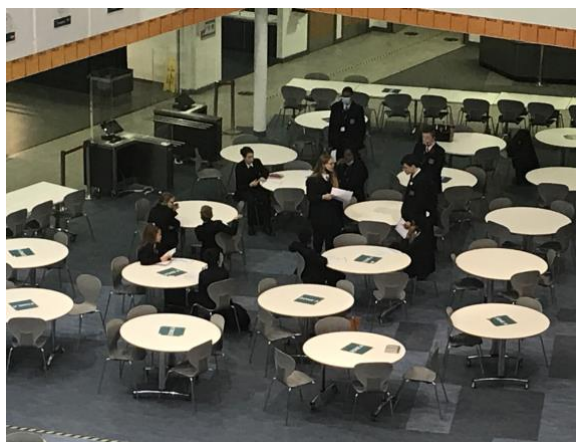
