I would like to cover two big issues this week. You will have seen numerous stories relating to COVID-19 in schools and will have received news of the first positive cases in our Academy. I know that this will cause uncertainty and nervousness within the community.

I can assure parents/carers that we are taking every step we can to mitigate the risk. External inspection concluded that we had "set the bar very high" in the work done to manage the risk. This is under constant review. We are retaining our high expectations to ensure that staff can focus on managing the risk as well wider education. An example of this is why we are focussing on equipment to ensure equipment is not shared.

If, and when we receive notification of positive tests, we act quickly to gain expert advice and we then follow that advice. We will always share the information when we are able to. 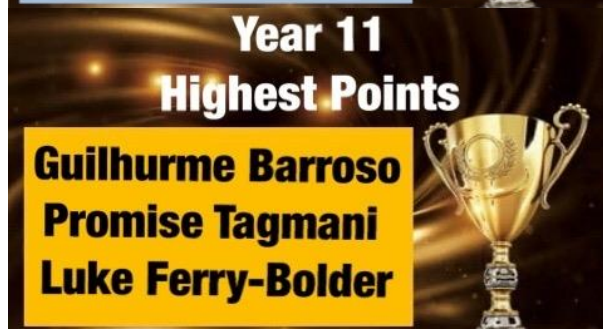
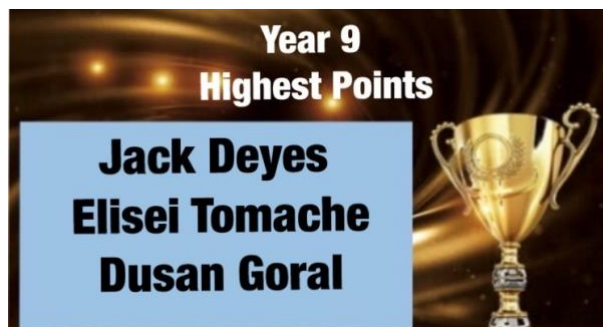
NO LIMITS:
