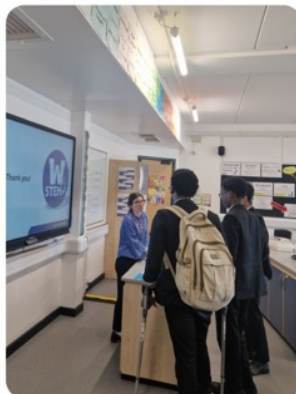


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## OXFORD & CAMBRIDGE

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## Help Us Shine a Light on the Future of the Performing Arts

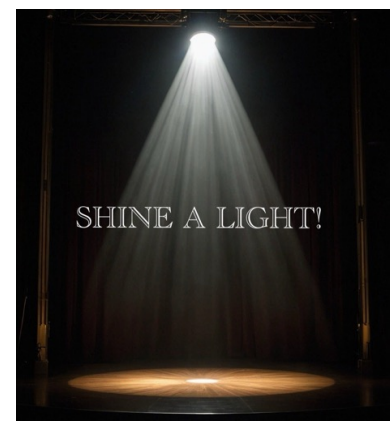
